1. The specifications and drawings for subject project are hereby modified
as follows (revise all specification indices, attachment lists, and drawing
indices accordingly).

a. Specifications. (Descriptive Changes.)

1. General Wage Decision Nos. CO020006 & CO020012 delete these
general wage decisions in their entirety and substitute the
attached modified General Wage Decision Nos. CO020006 and
CO020012, dated 08/16/2002.
2. Section 01007, Page 16, paragraph 1.11.7, delete the text of
the paragraph and substitute "Provide a complete security
system in the Satellite Pharmacy. The system shall be
compatible with the Base Security System, which is called
Advanced Entry Control System and is manufactured by Diebold.
The security system shall consist of a balanced magnetic
switch on the door and combination ultrasonic/infrared motion
sensors for the entire room area and same type of motion
sensors around the perimeter above the ceiling. The door into
the pharmacy shall have a pushbutton cypher lock per Section
01003. The window shall have a rolling metal counter door per
Section 01003. Ensure motion sensors are placed in such as
manner that shaking of the rolling metal counter door does not
cause false alarms. The security panel shall be located in
the pharmacy room unless directed to another location by the
user. The security panel shall send alarms over a dedicated
connection at the telephone backboard and back to a central
location. The conduit system shall be rigid metal. See other
requirements given on sheet E9-2 for the intrusion detection
system. The panel shall have a built in audio/visual alarm.
Note that opening the door the proper way through the cypher
lock shall not cause an alarm via the balanced magnetic
switch."

3. Section 01355, at the end of this section, insert the attached Endangered Species Letter.
